An Act to control the entry of persons, animals and vehicles upon licensed aerodromes

[26TH MARCH, 1965]

ENACTED by the Parliament of the United Republic of Tanzania.

1. This Act may be cited as the Aerodromes Control Act, 1965.

Short title

2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires—

Interpretation

“licensed aerodrome” means a Government aerodrome or an aerodrome licensed under any law in force in Tanzania;

“Minister” means the Minister for the time being responsible for civil aviation.

3.—(1) The Minister may make regulations, not inconsistent with any order or regulation made under any other law in force in Tanzania regulating licensed aerodromes, for prohibiting, restricting or controlling the entry of any person, animal or vehicle to a licensed aerodrome or any part thereof, and for controlling the movement of any person, animal or vehicle within such licensed aerodrome.

Regulations

(2) Regulations made under this section may be applied generally or to any specified licensed aerodrome or aerodromes.

(3) Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, regulations made under this section may—

(a) prescribe fees to be paid by any person or in respect of any animal or vehicle entering or remaining on a licensed aerodrome, or any part thereof;

(b) provide in respect of a breach of the provisions thereof penalties not exceeding a fine of four thousand shillings or imprisonment for a term of six months or both such fine and imprisonment;

(c) authorize the removal of any person, animal or vehicle from any licensed aerodrome or part thereof where the presence of such person, animal or vehicle is prohibited or, unless he or it satisfies any necessary conditions, is restricted.

Powers of
arrest of
Police
Officer

4. Where a police officer has reasonable grounds to believe that any person has committed an offence against any regulations made under this Act, he may require such person to furnish him with his name and address and reasonable evidence of his identity; and if such person fails to give his name and address and such evidence or if he gives a name or address which such police officer has reasonable grounds to believe to be false, the police officer shall have power to arrest such person without warrant.

Regulations
to be
displayed

5. The Minister shall cause copies of all regulations made under this Act to be conspicuously displayed at every aerodrome to which such regulations apply.
